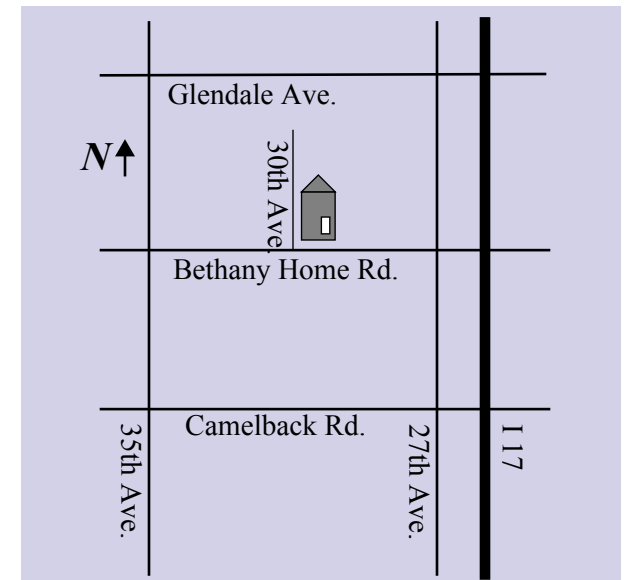
The Friday evening Theologue will be held in a private residence. Please contact us for location and directions.

Dr. James White is the director of Alpha and Omega Ministries, a Christian apologetics organization based in Phoenix, Arizona. He has authored or contributed to more than twenty books. He is an accomplished debater, having engaged in more than one-hundred moderated, public debates with leading proponents of Roman Catholicism, Islam, Jehovah's Witnesses, and Mormonism, as well as critics such as Bart Ehrman, John Dominic Crossan, Marcus Borg, and John Shelby Spong. He is an elder of the Phoenix Reformed Baptist Church, has been married to Kelli for more than twenty-eight years, and has two children, Joshua and Summer.



Pastor Rick Anderson grew up in the west. He graduated from the University of Wyoming with a degree in Mechanical Engineering and then attended the University of Notre Dame Law School, graduating in 1976. It was while practicing law in Wyoming that he was saved by God's grace. Rick was involved in a private practice and then as a criminal prosecutor for 10 years. In 1987 he began attending the Master's Seminary and upon graduation was called to Faith Community Church. Rick has been pastoring at Faith Community since 1989.
